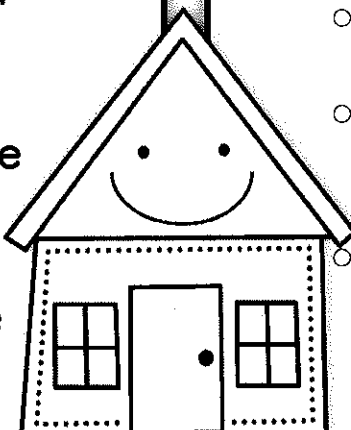
## Vocabulary
