Vocabulary

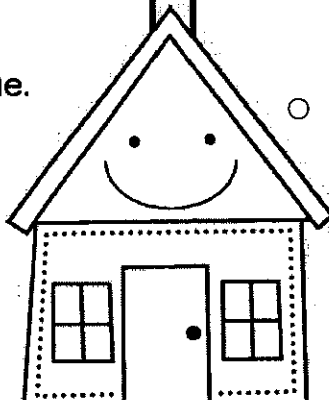
- Armed Forces: The five parts of the American military
