We will see that pictures can give us clues to help us understand words that we do not know the meaning of. We will learn that there is more than one way to retell stories.

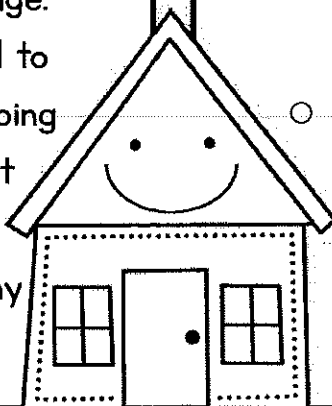
Vocabulary
