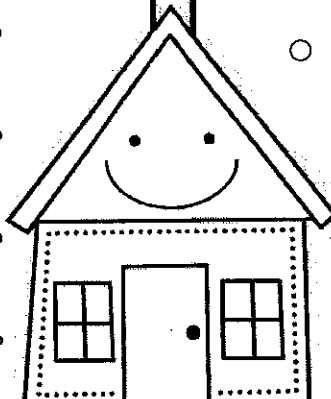
Vocabulary
